



Why did you join the Newquay Marine Group?

There's so many! I do particularly love Bottle Nose dolphins, we have an in-shore pod which swim around our Cornish coast but when they come around Newquay, they're fantastic to watch.

What do you think Newquay Marine Group has done for Newquay over the years?

It's encouraged people to care for the environment, like organising beach cleans like Newquay Beach Care does. They went around doing surveys and meeting up with people who are in different businesses to try and stop people from using plastics in their shops, such as fish & chips shops and fast-food takeaway shops. Newquay Marine Group has also done lots of cleaning up and re-decorating the Harbour Heights. They've gone on boats going around the Cornish coast looking for plastics by dragging a sieve across the bay, and it's picked up tiny microplastics - it's quite shocking to think what we've got in the water. Newquay Marine Group has also got the fish symbol outside drains to help people identify the things that should go down the drains and not to throw any rubbish down there.
